#### In pursuit of a circular economy: Kenya enacts Extended Producer Responsibility regulations

Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) is increasingly being adopted by countries to address waste management challenges. EPR holds producers accountable for their product's life cycle and is based on the polluter pays and zero waste principles of environmental law.

#### Key highlights of Kenya's Public Participation Bill, 2024

The Constitution of Kenya, 2010 revolutionised governance by embedding public participation as a fundamental pillar of democracy. This inclusive approach ensures that the voices, needs and aspirations of Kenyans are central to decision-making, from policy formulation to legislative development. Yet, for years, there has been no clear guidance for how public participation should be conducted.

#### Kenya unveils Carbon Market Regulations

The gazettement of the Climate Change (Carbon Markets) Regulations, 2024 (Regulations) on 17 May 2024, has set the stage for the regulatory oversight of carbon project development and management in Kenya. The Regulations have been enacted following a legal reform process that began with the amendment of the Climate Change Act, 2016 (Act) in 2023 to explicitly address carbon market concerns, and signal Kenya's readiness to intensify efforts to take on opportunities presented by the global carbon markets. The Regulations introduce the key provisions outlined below.
