EMPLOYMENT ALERT

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Employers Guide to Alert Level 3

South Africa will move to Alert Level 3 on 1 June 2020, in terms of which all businesses and other entities may commence operations, barring a few exceptions. The government has recommended that all employees continue to work from home where it remains possible. Where persons over the age of 60 and persons with co-morbidities return to work, employers must take special measures to ensure their safety.

to Alert Level 3

South Africa will move to Alert Level 3 on 1 June 2020. A summary of the permitted economic activities under each alert level are as follows:



LEVEL 5	LEVEL 4	LEVEL 3
Essential services only.	Essential and permitted services only.	All business and other entities, save for a few exceptions.

Level 3 Hotspots

The government has identified certain areas which are classified as hotspots, where there will be more stringent restriction on movement depending on whether the area has been Classified as Level 4 or Level 5
